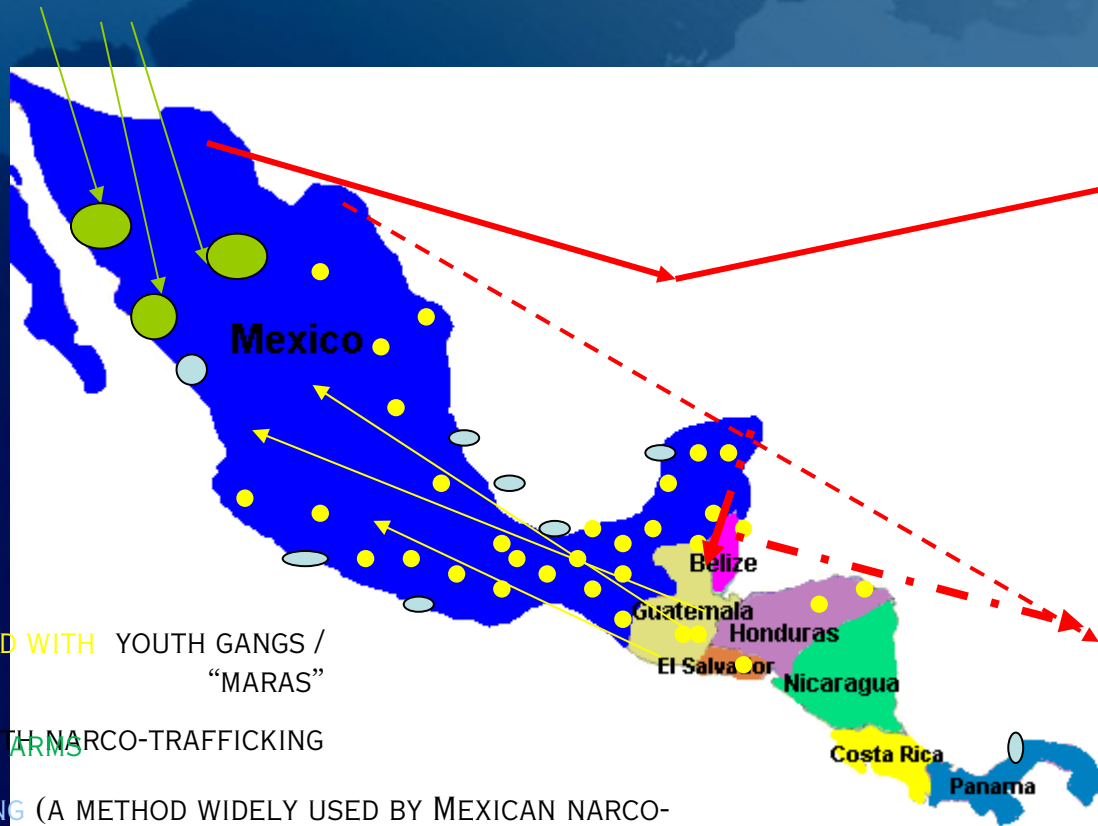

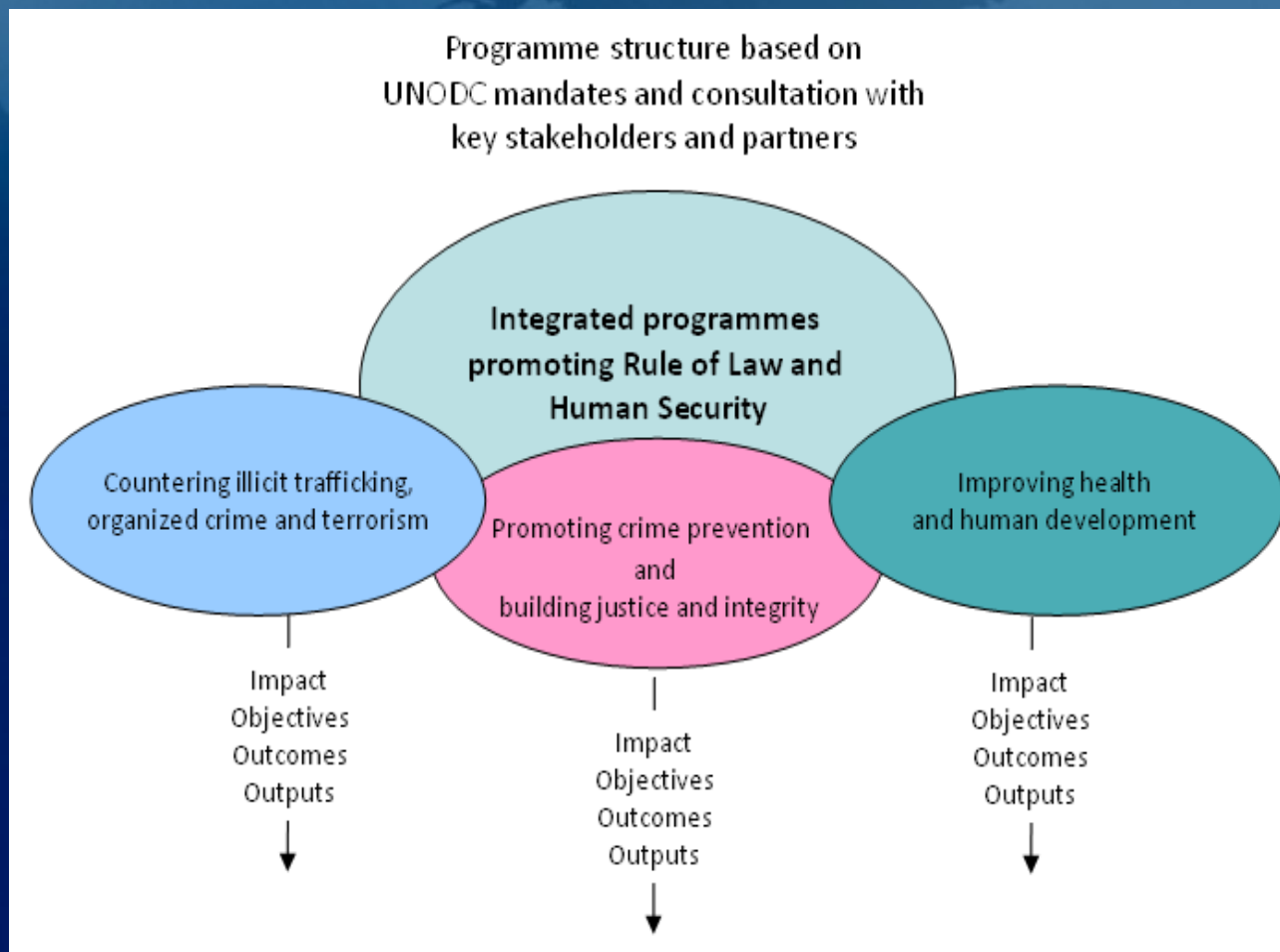

Guiding principles of UNODC's regional approach

THE GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

- DEVELOPING PROGRAMMES. ASSESSMENT AND PROGRAMME FORMULATION MISSIONS WERE FIELDDED IN ALL SELECTED COUNTRIES OF THE REGION TO IDENTIFY NEEDS FOR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (OCT 2008 – JUNE 2009);
- DIVERSIFYING PROGRAMMES. IN THE PAST YEARS, UNODC TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE WAS MOSTLY LIMITED TO DRUG-RELATED PROJECTS. WORK HAS NOW STARTED TO EXPAND THE PROGRAMME TO CRIME-RELATED AREAS;
- INTEGRATING REGIONAL AND COUNTRY PROGRAMMES. UNODC WILL FOCUS ON CROSS-CUTTING ISSUES, MAKING THE BEST USE OF ITS THEMATIC EXPERTISE

Selected outputs of the regional programme

- UPGRADE THE PROFESSIONAL SKILLS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN SPECIALIZED AREAS;
- COLLECT, COLLATE AND ANALYZE INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF INTELLIGENCE-LED OPERATIONAL RESPONSES;
- SUPPORT THE CONDUCT OF SPECIALIZED INVESTIGATIONS IN COMPLEX AND ORGANIZED CRIME CASES;
- PROMOTE INTEGRITY, PREVENT AND COMBAT CORRUPTION WITHIN SPECIALIZED LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES;
- REINFORCE AND BUILD COOPERATION AMONGST LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES BOTH WITHIN AND BETWEEN MEMBER STATES; AND
- SUPPORT THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORMS IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE RULE OF LAW.

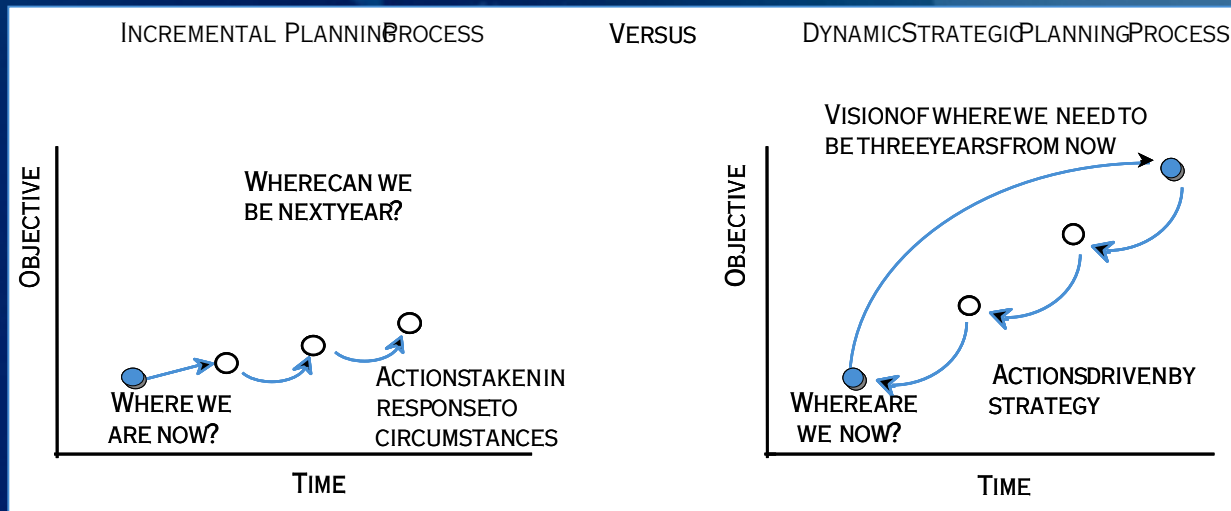

Experts Meeting in San José, Costa Rica (4-5 February 2009)

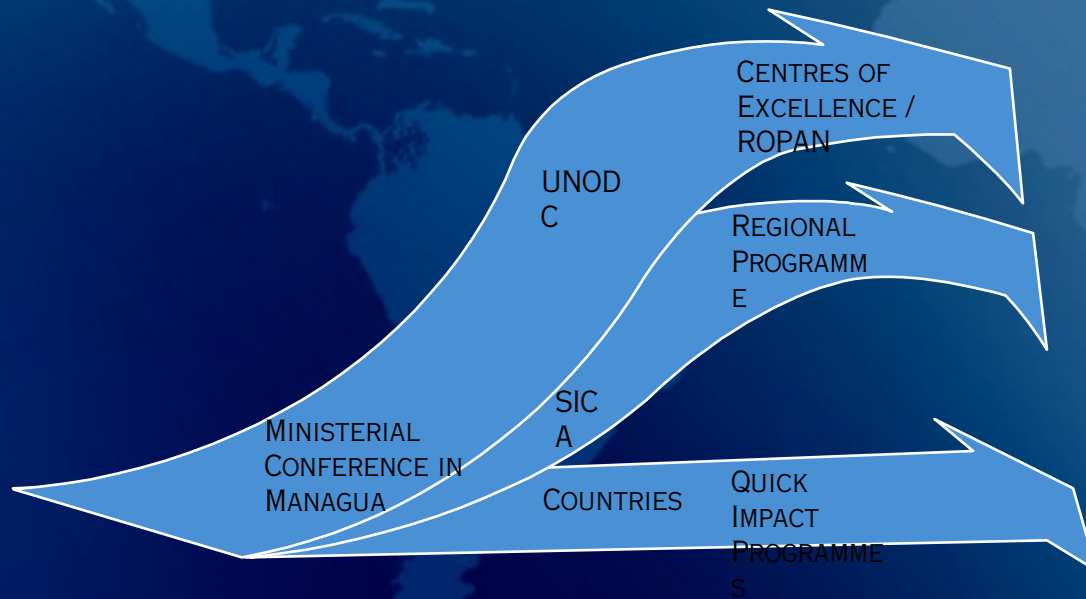

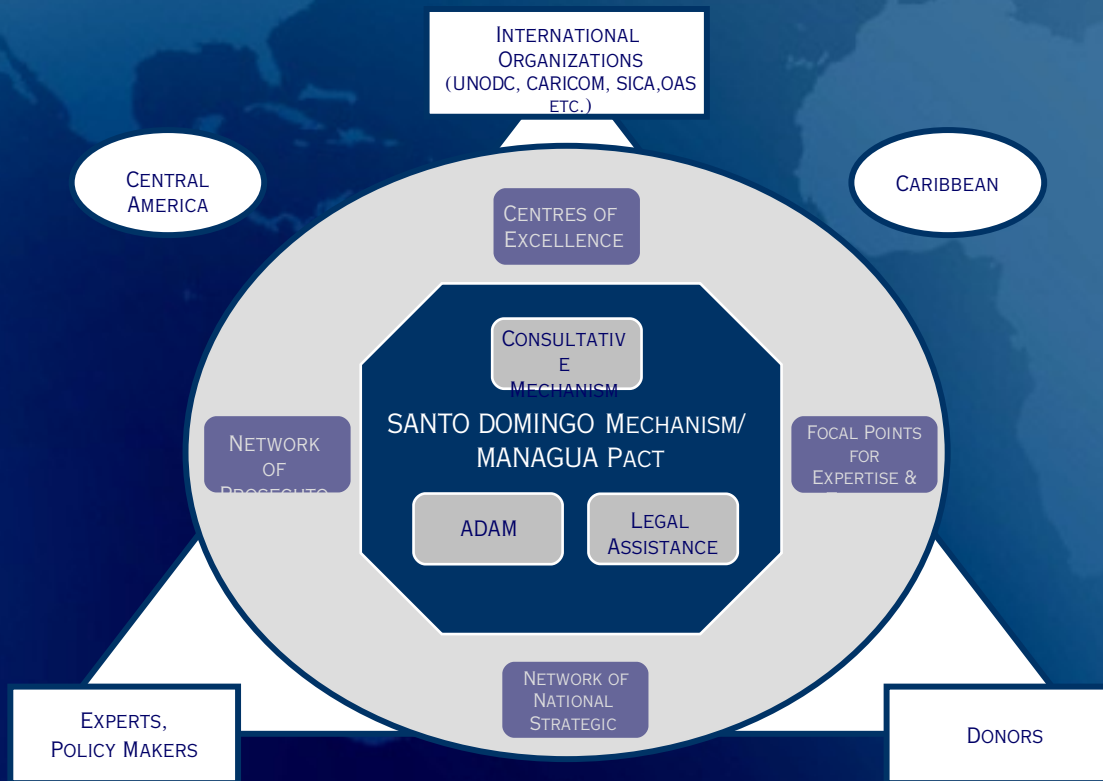

The Santo Domingo Pact and Managua Mechanism

- THE ***Santo Domingo Pact and Managua Mechanism*** IS AN INTER-REGIONAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME WITH THE OBJECTIVE OF FACILITATING PERIODICAL CONSULTATIONS AND STRATEGIC THINKING BETWEEN PARTNERS AT EXPERT AND POLICY LEVEL IN ORDER TO JOINTLY DISCUSS, IDENTIFY AND SET IN MOTION COORDINATED ACTIONS TO STEM THE INCREASING LEVELS OF ILLICIT DRUG TRAFFICKING AND RELATED ORGANIZED CRIME FROM, TO AND THROUGH ***Central America*** AND ***the Caribbean***.
